DEA Extends Flexibility Around In-Person Requirement until December 31, 2024: The DEA and HHS proposed allowing doctors to prescribe controlled substances through telemedicine, without meeting patients in person. To ensure continuous care during the COVID-19 pandemic, exceptions were made to existing regulations, allowing doctors to form new relationships with patients without in-person visits until November 11, 2023. After reviewing feedback from telemedicine sessions, these exceptions have now been extended until December 31, 2024, for new doctor-patient relationships.

<u>Telehealth Impact in Frontier Critical Access Hospitals:</u> Frontier areas are sparsely populated counties in states where 65% of the counties have six or fewer residents per square mile. Residents access primary care at critical access hospitals in these rural communities, but must travel great distances for specialty care.

<u>Healthcare Crisis in Rural Areas:</u> The healthcare crisis in rural areas is reaching a critical point, with more than 600 rural hospitals at risk of closure, leaving approximately 46 million people without access to necessary care. However, the prevalence of telehealth has provided a lifeline to these communities.

Libraries can offer privacy through dedicated spaces for telehealth visits. Libraries offer strong, reliable internet for people who may not have internet at home (or for people without stable housing). Libraries offer friendly staff to help people navigate digital interfaces and feel more comfortable with technology and libraries give patients access to technology, such as cameras, microphones, large monitors and adaptive keyboards. This makes for a better experience for both the patient and the provider.
