

The <u>NRTRC</u> is pleased to announce the release of our latest training course: <u>Navigating the Telehealth Neighborhood – Patient Portal Training for Digital Navigators</u>.

Building on the success of our initial course, <u>A Guide to Telehealth Basics and Virtual Appointments for Digital Navigators</u>, this course is designed to equip digital navigators with the knowledge and tools they need to support patients in effectively using patient portals.

Patient portals are secure online platforms provided by healthcare organizations that enable patients to access and manage their health information and communicate directly with their healthcare providers. Typically accessed via a web browser or mobile app, these tools are essential for fostering patient engagement and self-management.

Topics include account setup, essential features of patient portals, common troubleshooting strategies, and best practices for empowering users to manage

their healthcare confidently and independently. It is ideal for digital navigators, care coordinators, and any frontline professionals supporting patients in accessing digital health services.



Does Visit Modality Affect Visit Attendance?

The journal Telemedicine and e-Health recently published a paper, "The Impact of Telehealth Implementation and Visit Modality on No-Show Rate in a High-Risk Obstetrics Clinic in a Safety Net Healthcare System." This study broke new ground by examining the relationship between visit attendance and visit modality.

"Few studies have explored patient choice of visit modality between in-person, video, and telephone for prenatal care where exams are viewed as core to care and how this choice impacts no-show rate," the authors note. "This study evaluated the association between choice of visit modality and prenatal care visit attendance."
